# Coronavirus Update from the Department of Education

Over the last few months, you would have heard about the outbreak of the Coronavirus in China including the reports of confirmed cases in the UK as well as a recent increase in cases in Italy. If you have recently visited Northern Italy over the holiday period or other countries listed by the Department of Health in the last 14 days, parents/carers are encouraged to read the advice from the Department of Health regarding the Coronavirus. If you are experiencing cough or fever or shortness of breath, you should stay indoors and call NHS 111, even if symptoms are mild. If you have recently returned from any of the quarantined towns in Italy (Bertonico, Casalpusterlengo, Castelgerundo, Castiglione d'Adda, Codogno, Fombio, Maleo, San Fiorano, Somaglia, Terranova dei Passerini -all in Lodi province in Lombardy -and Vo' Euganeo in Padova province, Veneto) you should follow the government advice and self-quarantine.
