
If you are willing, there are a few different ways you could do this:

- Use <a href="https://vocaroo.com/">https://vocaroo.com/</a> to do a voice recording and send me the link.



Class 1 have been designing and making teacups inspired by the characters from *The Jolly Postman*.
















Class 2 were set the challenge to design and construct a Cornish engine house this term. They have worked so hard investigating, designing and finally making them and they look fantastic!






Class 3 have been creating explanation texts about the structure of the Earth.
