Covid Updates

Contingency Plan: We have plans in place in case pupils need to remain at home due to a positive Covid-19 result. You can find the plan on our website by following this link:

Essentially, in order to ensure continuity, class teachers and teaching assistants will support your child's learning through daily contact via virtual meetings, emails and learning platforms. The government have raised the expectation that if a child is isolating and is still well that they should be working for the whole school day, following a similar timetable to the one offered in schools (and they want this to happen without any added pressure on parents, staff or pupils!) At the moment teaching staff are managing these duel roles on top of their working day, however if we have a rise in the number of children isolating due to Covid-19 then this role may be managed by teaching assistants out of their normal class time.

Tempest Photo Sessions

There are some changes to the Tempest photo sessions this year due to Covid-19. They will only take photographs of individual children and not family groups. Can all pupils wear school uniform on Tuesday 20th October, even those children who would usually come into school in PE kits. Thank you.

Pupils Eligible for Pupil Premium funding
