Dear Parents and Carers,

We are currently developing our Personal, Social and Health Education provision, integrating Relationships and Sex Education into the curriculum. The government have made Relationships education compulsory this year for primary schools and in preparation for this new requirement we have become a Jigsaw school which provides a holistic and mindful approach to PSHE. In PSHE sessions, from Reception to Class 6, there are progressive themes that run throughout the school. This half term the whole school is focussing on Celebrating Differences, with age appropriate class sessions raising awareness of differences, anti-bullying strategies, and celebrating our diverse world. With our developing RSE curriculum, the Year 5 and 6 relationships element incorporates puberty and consent. This then links with our science curriculum where children learn about how animals reproduce and this then leads into human reproduction. We welcome feedback from parents and carers and therefore a copy of our draft policy will be sent to parents tomorrow with comments and feedback welcomed during this consultation period.

Class 5 Remote Learning

Well done to all of Class 5 and a massive thank you to Mrs Gall for making our first remote learning experience such a positive one. Children have met virtually with Mrs Gall twice a day, and have become experts at navigating their way around the school timetable, online tasks, being resourceful and developing their independence. Many thanks to parents from Class 5 for supporting the children's learning during this difficult time.

Covid Cases, Symptoms and Testing

Please can we ask parents to keep communicating with us regarding symptoms, isolation, track and trace app isolation and testing. If a member of your household shows symptoms of Covid then the whole household needs to isolate. Please do not send your child to school if someone in your household has symptoms.

Data Forms

On Friday, the children will be bringing home their individual data collection forms in named envelopes. This form contains your child's personal details and details of their priority contacts list. If there are any updates that need to be made please return the form (making sure to sign and date!) to the school office.

Learning Out and About and In School

Phonics Screening Check – Pupils in Class 2 are being assessed on their phonics knowledge over the next two weeks. This assessment was previously timetabled for Year 1 summer term, but due to Covid 19 the government have decided to assess Year 2 pupils this term. The children have daily phonics session, and this check has been carried out as part of their normal reading time, working with Mrs Bailey to read real and alien words. Parents will be informed about the outcome of these assessments by the end of term.

Reception Adventure Club – On Tuesday morning Reception class will be heading out with Miss Tremewan. **Outcomes** – At the beginning of term, dates of shared outcomes were given optimistically in the Curriculum Information leaflets. Our outcomes this term are being adapted by class teachers so that children can share this term's learning with their families at home.

Remote Learning

As part of our Contingency Plan, teachers are ready to support home learning. We have plans in place in case pupils need to remain at home due to a positive Covid-19 result. Essentially, in order to ensure continuity, class teachers and teaching assistants will support your child's learning through daily contact via virtual meetings, emails and learning platforms. The government have raised the expectation that if a child is isolating and is still well that they should be working for the whole school day, following a similar timetable to the one offered in schools.

Pupil Premium funding

The Local Authority are giving vouchers to pupils eligible for Free School Meals over the Christmas holidays. This will be £15 per pupil per week. More details of this will be given by the LA nearer the time. A reminder that Pupil Premium pupils are now able to join Breakfast Club for free.

School field facilities

The Mariners are working closely with the school to create an outdoor shelter and toilet facility on the school field, to enable the field to be used more frequently for a variety of activities including outdoor learning, forest school, P.E., visual and performing arts activities and school community events. The long term ambition is to create an attractive wooden built, permanent structure, and toilet, and we will be fundraising for this over the next 18 months. In the short term however, we are keen to help get a temporary solution up and running asap to enable each of the year groups to use the field for outdoor learning and to potentially use the outdoor shelter for upcoming Christmas performances! With Covid still shaping the world we live in, we are keen to support and facilitate access to the outdoors for inspirational learning experiences, enabling our children to connect to nature, and contributing positively to their educational experience and physical and emotional well being. One way we can do this is by supporting the development of facilities which make it more possible for children to learn outside.

This is a callout to see if any of the school community may have skills, contacts, links or material to help us! We have a modest budget and we need to source scaffolding and corrugated galvanised steel roofing sheets, and are also looking for tradespeople with the right skills to help put the structure together.
