School Update

Last term, the government announced nationally that all school staff are entitled to a payrise due to the cost of living. This was well received by staff, however the government expects schools to fund the payrise and no extra funding has been given to schools.

What does this mean for Marlborough School? In April, Governors set a tight budget that allowed us to maintain the standard of educational provision that we need at Marlborough. The pay increases awarded will have a £45,000 knock on effect to our budget. We had £33,000 saved, as a safety buffer, which will now go towards funding the pay increases. We also need to save £12,000 from this financial years' budget. We have had to make changes from the start of this term to enable us to finish the financial year at £0. We do not yet know how schools will be financed from April, but we are envisaging more cuts on the horizon.

Why are we telling you this? Many of our teaching staff and support staff are members of Unions. The Unions are sharing their thoughts and ideas with the government regarding school funding but if they are not heard, staff may be asked to take strike action to make our voices heard. We will keep you updated.

As NAHT's general secretary said over the weekend in an Observer newspaper feature: "School leaders are relentlessly reasonable people and they have held their schools together throughout a decade of underfunding of education, eroded salaries, and a pandemic. But the anger and even despair we are hearing from our members right now is unprecedented. School leaders across the country are telling me they cannot continue to run their schools in the current circumstances. Insufficient pay has caused a severe recruitment and retention crisis and the education and support that can be given to pupils is suffering as a consequence. No school leader would ever vote for industrial action lightly but they feel compelled to fight for the futures of the children and young people and staff in their care. The future of education in this country is on the line."
