Learning Out and About and in School

Class 4 Adventure Club – Class 4 are recreating features of castles on Swanpool Beach this morning.

Class 6 Engineering Challenge – Class 6 will be working with The Rotary Club today, finding out about their charity work in Uganda bringing fresh water to villages. The class will then have a go at finding different ways to purify water.
