Learning Out and About and in School

Reflection Spaces – We are very lucky to have Jane Wheeler and her team setting up reflection spaces in our garden area this week. All children and staff will have the opportunity to find peace, calm and have time for reflection using the multi-sensory activities that the team will set up.

Sports Days – Reception, Class 1 and Class 2 are competing today and Classes 3 to 6 are competing tomorrow. Families are invited to watch the competitions.
