Playground Equipment - Can you help?

As you will be aware, children's toys and games often have a limited shelf life. They're often not returned to where they should be kept and even if they are, can be handed back a little the worse for wear. As you can imagine, if this happens at home, the increased numbers at school can have quite an impact and the result is that we are running a bit thin on our playground games and toys. We would like to transfer some of the older PE equipment to provide more break and lunchtime activities but can only do so of course once we've replaced them with appropriate sports kit. We will also look to buying some specific materials so that the children have a choice of activities – but again our resources are limited.

I have spoken to the children suggesting that if they have any old outdoor toys that could serve for general playground use that they would like to share with friends and donate to the school we would be very grateful. Of course the equipment will need to be serviceable ad we will need to check its safety and suitability, but it would be good to increase the range of things the children can play at lunchtime, without having to reach too deep into our pockets.

We have been given a couple of buckets of Lego and one idea proposed is that if we could make a large circular mat with a draw skin and collect other old Lego we could make this available for some playtimes. The children's parliament will plan to work on a few other suggestions, and hopefully organise some monitors to make sure everything is used and put away well to extend the life of the equipment we have.

Whilst we can and will order some appropriate <u>play</u> balls for use at playtimes, I do need to ask parents not to send children in with leather footballs or heavy or hard plastic/rubber balls as these can be dangerous and are certainly intimidating for younger children. The playground is a limited space and we need to keep it safe and enjoyable for everyone to use together.
