They set a target of £300 for the evening... but achieved a fantastic £1,142! Well done to them and thank you to everyone who went out of their way to make the evening such a success, both in the enjoyment we shared and the money raised. We've now already enough to purchase a defibrillator for the school, but are very eager that we make this life-saving equipment available for the local community, and there is some way to go to make sure we can buy in the on-going maintenance and checking support. However, with some other generous donations received and further intentions do hope to be able to install a defibrillator for school and community use in the new year. We've also been offered some training sessions for parents – the evidence is that where children see adults confident in first aid they develop healthy attitudes that can save lives.

## Family Christmas Crafting Workshop



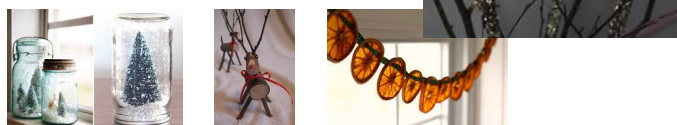
Friday 2nd December, 14:00-17:00 in the School Hall.

Send a Bag of Love,  
to tell the children of Syria  
they are not forgotten.

**Why we are appealing:** the bags have been requested by the doctors in Aleppo UK Action **for Refugees** are supplying with medical aid. The children arriving at the hospitals are deeply shocked and traumatised and there are no provisions especially for them.

**What we need:** a small cuddly toy, coloured pens or pencils with a sharpener, a pad of paper, a bag of halal\* sweets, an outdoor toy such as a skipping rope or ball.

**Please don't send:** toy guns or soldiers, chocolate or other perishables, or battery powered toys.

\* Please make sure that, if you are donating sweets, they do not contain gelatin.

There will be boxes in school reception from 21<sup>st</sup> November to leave any items you're able to donate. These will be packed by volunteers, in Penzance on 4<sup>th</sup> December, into individual draw-string cloth bags so that each child can be handed a comfort pack as they arrive at the hospital. The bags will be shipped in a consignment bound for Aleppo in the second week of December.
