Dear Parents and Carers,

We are nearly at the end of the first half term of this academic year. Covid Updates

Contingency Plan: We have plans in place in case pupils need to remain at home due to a positive Covid-19 result. You can find the plan on our website by following this link:

Essentially, in order to ensure continuity, class teachers and teaching assistants will support your child's learning through daily contact via virtual meetings, emails and learning platforms. The government have raised the expectation that if a child is isolating and is still well that they should be working for the whole school day, following a similar timetable to the one offered in schools (and they want this to happen without any added pressure on parents, staff or pupils!) At the moment teaching staff are managing these duel roles on top of their working day, however if we have a rise in the number of children isolating due to Covid-19 then this role may be managed by teaching assistants out of their normal class time.

Social Distancing: Please can we ask adults collecting children at the end of the day to observe social distancing guidance. Thanks

Online Safety

There has been a rise in the numbers of children who are being subjected to abuse whilst online due to Covid-19. Data from 2019 shows that there are 80,000 adults preying on children in the UK online and 20% of these victims are age 11 and under. The recent surge in Live Streaming has opened a direct line between abusers and children, with 1 in 20 children being asked to take their clothes off during live streaming. Please be vigilant about your child's online activity; set privacy settings and have open conversations about the risks of the online world. The Child Exploitation and Online Protection website (CEOPS) has a report button where you can share information of online abuse with the police.

Pencil Cases

Thank you for providing individual pencil cases for each child in school, it has ensured that frequently used resources are able to be used by just one person. Your child will be bringing their pencil case home over half term; could you please have a look through it and replace any depleted resources. Children in Reception class do not need a pencil case.
