2022 Key Stage 2 Results

Class 6 pupils have achieved brilliantly in their end of Key Stage SATs. Our attainment scores are well above the national level of attainment. We have not yet received our official progress scores but looking at individual pupils we are incredibly happy with each child's learning progress. Many thanks to Class 6 families for supporting your child's journey through Marlborough and to the teaching team for the quality provision they have provided.
