



Musical Instrument Tuition



Our music tuition lessons continue this term. Those children who had lessons last term will continue to do so this term, so please remind your child to bring their instrument into school on their lesson day. Lessons are on-going from term to term, year to year, therefore, if your child no longer requires music tuition you must inform our lesson providers Cornwall Music Service Trust, giving them a term's notice. Your child's music lessons continue as follows:

Monday	– brass (trumpet/cornet)	from 11 th January
Monday	– guitars (classical)	from 11 th January
Tuesday	– keyboard/piano	from 12 th January
Wednesday	– woodwind (flute/clarinet)	from 6 th January
Thursday	– strings (violin/cello)	from 7 th January

If your child has expressed an interest in learning to play an instrument please ask at the school office for further information. Tuition is provided mainly to children in years 3 to 6 but may be suitable for year 2 children at the tutor's discretion. Lessons are delivered by specialist teachers through Cornwall Music Service Trust at our school and your child will need to bring their instrument to school for their lesson once a week.

- Lessons take place in small groups during the school day.
 - Group of 4/5 (30mins) £5.00
 - Group of 3 (22.5mins) £5.00
 - Group of 3 (30mins) £6.70
 - Group of 2 (30mins) £10.00
 - Group of 2 (20mins) £6.70
 - Individual (20mins) £13.50
 - Award student 1 to 1 (30mins) £10.00 partially funded by CMST - please contact the office for more details

MINORITY INSTRUMENTS ~ Viola, Cello & Double Bass, Oboe & Bassoon, Horn, Baritone & Tuba (including Euphonium), Bass Guitar

All the above instruments will receive an individual lesson or a lesson in a pair (depending on numbers, abilities and uptake) for 20 minutes at £5 per session. Subsidised by Cornwall Music Education Hub.

SUBSIDIES

1. Children currently eligible for free school meals and/or in care will receive £5 subsidy per lesson
2. Children with one or more parents serving in the British Armed Forces will receive £5 subsidy per lesson
3. Children, or parent, in receipt of Disability Living Allowance will receive £2.50 subsidy per lesson

In general, whether new or second-hand, the more you pay the better the instrument. The least expensive instruments may have defects that will handicap the learner. Alternatively you may want to consider hiring the instrument from the county music service Music Cornwall, who will hire out an instrument to your child for a maximum four terms.
