Instead

I am writing this newsletter at the same time as preparing to take part in an Instead Inspection on Monday and Tuesday this week – part of the 'deal' in asking colleague headteachers to assist in our own Instead Review a month ago. The report is now with us 'hot off the press' and I have not yet shared it fully with staff, but wanted to share the key messages with parents, as the team do know these. The experience did not differ so much from the intensity of an Ofsted Inspection. It was rigorous and indeed, as we were working in partnership, it seemed at times to dig even deeper into the way we analyse issues and work to address them.

The purpose of the Instead review was to consider the evidence available and determine areas of strength and areas for development support of further school improvement and also to secure the school's own self-evaluation of progress made towards its goals.

The Instead team was asked to take an overview of the school's performance, concentrating on:

- how the school's approach to Learning to Learn is being embedded and how effective this is
- the extent to which feedback impacts on children's progress
- the extent to which presentation in books demonstrates a positive application to learning

Overall strengths of the school:

Learning and teaching: The targeted questioning seen in some classes was very strong and clearly supported accelerated progress, particularly evident in the very best cases where SEND and PP pupils were concerned. This good practice needs sharing more widely.

Pupils: Pupils behaviour, resilience, confidence, enthusiasm and ability to contribute so sensibly to the life of the school, was impressive. Pupils have a very clear pride in being a part of the Marlborough School community and 'Marlborough Manners' were very evident.

Community: Parental support for their school and their engagement in its life was impressive.

Leadership: The appointment of the three assistant heads has lead to a more delegated structure of leadership and shows great promise... already impacting positively on the accountability of those staff responsible for children's progress. Very evident was the 'buy in' that staff demonstrate for the vision of a learning school and one where every child's progress matters.

Recommendations

The school should:

prioritise - deciding upon and embedding the agreed feedback policy

develop - in consultation, a clear approach for home learning

maximise - the reflective approach where priorities are regularly evaluated (hence the upturn in outcomes at ks2 in 2017 and a renewed and invigorated leadership structure)

sustain: the involvement of the pupils in the life of the school; they know their voice matters and leads to action in their best interests.



The observation about homework came chiefly from discussions with the school parliament's cabinet. Admittedly this was a bit of a surprise, but probably particularly relevant alongside the current Learning to Learn project; the developing use of the Exploring Reading books and the new Feedback Policy. We have 'ticked off' the instead priority action, but will of course continue to monitor the effectiveness of the policy as we embed it over the coming weeks. We also know that we can continue to improve the quality of the communication of Reading learning at school and at home through the red books. Thank you everyone for using these and especially for ensuring that they do generally come home and are returned to school each day! We are eager to gather further and comprehensive views about the service Marlborough provides and I will write with details of how you can log on to a **Parent Survey**, provided by GL.

We need Infant parents' help in one particular way as we bring back an old favourite, targeted to complete the improvement of the outdoor area outside the reception and key stage 1 classrooms...
