### Dear Parents

### Final Week

It's been one of those slightly surreal days in school – not noticeably quieter, but certainly lacking and missing the year 6 children who have hopefully enjoyed their first induction day at their respective Secondary Schools. It will be a busy week back here as we complete the term's work with children and some class teachers relocate. The children will also get a 'taster' session with their new class teachers on Wednesday; a Beach Event on Thursday (please see packed-lunch and collection details below); and the end of term at 14:00 on Friday afternoon. We hope to see as many of the school family as possible down at **Swanpool** on **Friday** evening, especially to catch up with the leavers.

### Governors

Behind the scenes we have also been busy, ensuring that we're putting all the inspection report action plans into place and that governors are assigned areas to monitor. It has been a particularly busy period for them and I'd like to thank the board members for their support throughout this term in particular. All of the governors do the job voluntarily and they receive little recognition. As you are aware, we have a ballot under way for the two Parent Governor vacancies which will bring us back almost to full strength. Sadly, we lost some experienced and dedicated governors earlier this year and I don't think we properly acknowledged the support Jen West, Alan Rowe and Helen Morton gave us over the years: thank you to all three. We also owe Helen Turner a great deal of gratitude: as those who attended the governors' meeting in June will know, Helen planned to step down at the end of this school year. She has passed on the chairmanship, but agreed to continue to serve for next term, to help provide some continuity as the new governors, including another co-opted member, settle in. Ben Gowers and Marylou Delaney take on the lead as chair and vice-chair respectfully for the start of the new year.

### School Collaboration and Partnership

Parents will know that much of the governors attention in recent years has been meeting the challenge of the growth of Academy Chains and loss of traditional partnerships within the Local Aurthority. Our 'Cowethas' links with Mabe and Constantine were lost when they saw their future within a Multi Academy Trust. We've done some informal but supportive work with Nansloe, particularly in re-establishing the (now) 6 R's of the Learning Powers and setting up our weekly Learning Conferences and hope this relationship continues. However, building a strong and sustainable partnership that recognises our individuality with like-minded schools has remained an aim for us. With this in mind we have been speaking with the Paula Quinney and her team at Boskenwyn and Germoe: the child centred learning there and their local community commitment accord strongly with Marlborough's principles, and we are looking forward to working together in a partnership that will support and strengthen all schools from next term.


