

Class 3 Curriculum Information The Street Beneath our Street

History/Geography Focus

This term year 3 are basing their learning around the Stone Age to the Iron Age taking in most aspects of the curriculum. This term's outcome will be a class assembly on .

English – During the term we will write a story based on 'Stone Age Boy'. We will also create an information book about aspects of the Stone Age and continue the term with newspaper reports and a set of instructions based on 'How to wash a woolly mammoth'.

Maths – We will focus on multiplication and division, money, statistics, length and perimeter and fractions through the use of concrete, pictorial and abstract methods.

Science – Linked to our topics we will be looking at rocks and fossils. In the second part of the term we will look at magnets and forces.

Computing – communicating and databases

Music – describing music (linked to PE dance sessions) and performance - learning and singing 'We will rock you' (words link to science topic to aid learning of vocabulary)

Use a made paper flute to achieve different pitches and create a composition which uses repeated patterns. Devise non-standard symbols for notation.

Outdoor learning – active maths and the daily 10 Art/DT – collage to represent images from 'The Street Beneath my Feet', recreate cave art patterns, make a working flute from paper, make a working drum from cardboard and paper P.E. - Dance based on the Stone Age to the Iron Age. Weekly gymnastic sessions with Vicky Pryor after half term. The Marlborough daily 10.

Home Learning

Children are expected to read at home every evening, preferably to an adult. Please record all reading that your child has read in their reading journal. This term we would like the children to complete at least 2 post reading activities per half term (ideas for activities at the front of the reading journal). Spelling lists are introduced on Mondays, these are linked to the games on spelling shed (login details at the front of spelling books).

Practice of number bonds is still important – to 10, 100, 1000 and also times tables using TT Rockstars (login details at the front of spelling books). All aspects of mathematical learning for this term will be sent home soon in the form of a leaflet.

Optional homework connected to our topic will be further research and presentations.
