## Dear Parents

We've received a number of replies concerning this week's meetings with the teachers. If you haven't already done so, please let us know if and when you intend coming and whether you wish to make use of the crèche that we have organised. This will help us to prepare for the evenings – simply call in at the office or email us on office @marlborough.cornwall.sch.uk. Thank you.

The plan for both meetings is that I will make a short and appropriate (ie tailored for infant and junior news) introduction in the school hall and then parents will move to their children's classes to meet their new teachers, who will explain how the class works, what they aim to achieve this year and how you can help your child. As the y0 team ran 'induction' meetings last term for the reception class, the infants' meeting is intended for parents of children in y1 and y2 only.

The new packet ship competition is under way with the year's first packet points in and recorded. Anywhere between 40 and 90 points were awarded to each packet in each class last week which, as you will appreciate, would lead to enormous totals so our y6 competition counters note the class packet points, put the teams in order, scoring the first packet 7 points, the second 5 and then 4, 3, 2, 1. These are then carried forward and added for a whole school total through each term.

Sports and some other competition events are held through the year and scored in the same way (essentially points in descending order with a bonus for the winning packet). You'll also note we've planned for our annual *Apple Day* on 7<sup>th</sup> October – we'll send details of how to get involved as soon as we're able. The *Oyster Festival* is set for the following week – I am meeting with organisers on Wednesday so hope to be able to pass on arrangements in the next newsletter. The diary dates we sent last term hinted at a possible *Equinox Day*, a time to get together on a *big dig*. We'll talk about an alternative day at this week's meetings.
