## Dear Parents

Thank you to everyone who managed to make last week's meeting to discuss the governors' follow-up action plans for the Ofsted Inspection. I am providing a summary of outcomes from the discussion here and we should be able to send a more thorough report, including a copy of my presentation notes to parents who have requested information shortly. It was a relatively well attended meeting (up to fifty parents, staff and governors) and I hope that everyone who did come shares the view that there was a fair and honest exchange of questions and views. The main sense governors took from the meeting was that there is a positive desire to move forward as a whole school community and that everyone here is committed to the school and eager to support the children in a range of ways.

## **Action Plan**

I opened the meeting by outlining developments since our previous inspection and describing the Development Plans that we have designed and used for school improvement over the past 4 years. We have benefitted from the guidance provided by School Effectiveness Cornwall and the NAHT Instead Review to help identify aspects of school life that do have required attention and that, whilst we recognise that not all planned targets have been met, the school has specific plans in place and is working towards improving those areas identified through the Ofsted process.

### Governance

Initial questioning concerned the role of governors, with particular attention to the transparency of the election and appointment of governors, the length of service and the structure of committees and working parties. The governors explained that we currently have some vacancies on the board and that having carried out an audit of skills are extremely eager to enrol governors need to be filled at the earliest opportunity. The local authority will shortly propose a replacement for Helen Turner who explained at the outset of the meeting that she had resigned her position last year and would be stepping down at the end of the summer term. A parent governor vacancy has also recently become available and an election will be organised for the start of the new school year.

# Clerking

The governors took the opportunity to ask if anyone present would be interested in taking on the role of clerk to the governors. This is a paid position requiring some training. Skills required include minuting meetings and guiding governors on procedure and minor legal matters. It can be an interesting and rewarding position and is currently being advertised. Further details will shortly be posted with job description and person specification on the school website. Please would all parents consider it!



### **Parental Feedback and Involvement**

Parents' response to the Ofsted request for feedback was felt to be low and concern expressed that the window of opportunity to access Parentview had been missed. In fact, all Ofsted's own letters of notification had been issued and the deadlines set by the inspection process: because the inspectors changed the period of inspection from one to two days there were time pressures and complications, not only in gathering parents views, but also other supporting evidence. With regard to parental engagement as a whole, which was also raised as a concern, Marlborough is extremely grateful for the support we receive. I explained that a Friends of Marlborough group had been disbanded in 2006 and replaced with a system of parents of children in v2, v4 and v6 leading social and fund-raising projects in turn. This ran successfully for some years, but was then replaced by the Marlborough Mariners which also ran some extremely positive, popular and successful events (eq a Family Treasure Hunt and the regular Sponsored Cycle ride), but has lapsed as parents involved have left. Every September and as events arise in newsletters we ask for assistance and invite parents to volunteer to get involved in activities, for example, the incredibly successful Big Digs. The traditional Apple Day is another example of this. Here particularly there was an honest exchange of opinions, the outcome of which has been an offer from Jon Christie and Lou Gall to hold a meeting to revive the Marlborough Mariners. This will be held at the school at 18:00 next Monday. We have a few events coming up – end of term fair, autumn sponsored cycle and Apple Day, for starters, so are very eager to enrol a team of volunteers to get involved: All Welcome!

### Communication – Website, Newsletters, etc

As ever when holding an open forum meeting the issue of communication was raised (the website is not seen as user friendly by everyone, newsletters are too wordy, notice can be late, etc). We acknowledged that systems are not perfect, but do our best through a range of methods to keep parents informed. Communication is a two way process and we do ask that parents access the website regularly and open newsletters. We do also provide texts, maintain class blogs and I am also always available at the school gate or by appointment. One parent suggested that improvements in Sport were an example of the school's response to issues raised and another identified the open classrooms every morning are a special feature of the school. Governors noted comments and will consider actions that can be taken to refine lines of communication. In the meantime, this is and remains an open school – please speak with appropriate staff whenever you need.

#### **Expectations**

This led on to one parent asking what the school requires of parents and, given the opportunity, but off the cuff I came up with:

- Punctual school starts each morning
- Do the Reading and Maths home learning (counting & tables fluency) at home with children
- Always attend the September meeting with the head and class teachers
- Read the newsletter (save the website as a 'favourite' if not your home page!)
- Volunteer for activities
- Let us know when we're not getting it right

From the floor then came a request for Volunteer Help in the Kitchen and for parents to come and have lunch with the children – see below.



Friday's meeting closed with a few parents sharing observations and views with regard to the inspection report. Comments were very supportive of the school and everyone present eager to move forward with positivity and purpose. We would like to share the views so many parents, grandparents and members of the community have express concerning the school as they find it and to record these on our website. If you would like to add your views in writing please email the office.

In short – the focus of the meeting concerned parental involvement and communication. Governors will consider all points raised, but immediate issues to be addressed are:

Governor membership	We wish to co-opt 2 governors with some financial/legal knowledge.

	There will be a parent governor election in September.
	Do ask any governor or the school office if you'd like further information.
Clerking	We are advertising for a clerk to the governors.
	This is a paid role with training provided – please ask if you are interested.

	<ul> <li>Meetings – please come to the September Meeting (Monday 17.09.18)</li> </ul>


