Dear Parents and Carers,

Tomorrow will be the first day of July which means there are only three weeks left of the summer term. As you can see from this newsletter, it is a busy three weeks with classes having visits, Adventure Club sessions, Sports Days, residentials and end of year celebrations. This week we have had to move to remote learning for a class and on Monday we had seven members of staff away due to Covid isolation guidelines. The word 'hopefully' is being used frequently, and it is wonderful to see class teachers, no matter how frazzled they are (and still without internet!), keep the optimism to plan events supporting your children with their happiness and learning. **Hopefully**, the next three weeks will give classes the opportunity to enjoy the end of this remarkable school year with their friends and teachers.

Class 4 Remote Learning

Parents of pupils in Class 4 found out last Thursday morning that, due to a positive Covid case, the bubble would be closed for 10 days. The pupil was assymptomatic and is feeling fine. Mr Gimenez was so impressed that many Class 4 pupils had logged onto Google Classroom and were raring to go with their Remote Learning without any prompting! Paper copies of resources have been made available if you are having technology issues. This isolation period collided with their sleepover in school and Sports Day, both of which have been rearranged. We are very much looking forward to seeing Class 4 on Monday!

Covid Cases, Symptoms and Testing

Please get a PCR test as soon as possible if you have any of these symptoms:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

Please note: A lateral flow test should not be used if you are displaying symptoms; the person with symptoms should take a PCR test. You and anyone you live with should stay at home until you get your test result. Only leave your home to have a test. Anyone in your childcare or support bubble should also stay at home if you have been in close contact with them since your symptoms started or during the 48 hours before they started. Please continue to inform the office if your child shows symptoms of Covid-19, is being tested, is awaiting a test result and the outcome of the test. Please continue to inform the office if someone in your household has symptoms and the result of the Covid test. All household members need to isolate if someone displays symptoms.

Sports Day Session

We have had two out of our three Sports Day sessions. It has been wonderful for the children to share this event with an audience. Many thanks to Matt Swiggs for organising and to the Mariners for helping making the event go ahead safely.

Safety Measures for Sports Day Sessions

- Classes and spectators will be kept on separate sides of the school field.
- Spectators will be able to enter the school field 15 minutes before the start of the session.
- Spectators will need to be seated during the session.
- Spectators will sit in groups with a maximum of 30 people with distancing between household groups.

- The names and phone numbers of spectators will be noted to enable us to track and trace should a member of the group develop Covid symptoms.
- If anyone within the group becomes positive all members of the group will be contacted to isolate.
- Masks will need to be worn when spectators are walking around the field. They can be removed once seated.
- DO NOT ATTEND if you have symptoms of Covid or you are isolating due to close contact with Covid.

Learning Out and About and In School
