Marlborough pupils do their bit to tackle climate change and help wildlife

Pupils from Marlborough School in Falmouth took a break from the regular school day last Thursday to plant an amazing wild woodland on the edge of their school field. The school had successfully applied for a wildlife hedging pack from the Woodland Trust, which comprised of 135 native tree saplings. Children from across the school visited the field in half hour slots and, assisted by a marvellous group of parent and grandparent volunteers, each child planted a tree. In addition they wrote climate pledges of things they could personally do to help tackle climate change by reducing their carbon emissions. Along with a number of wishes for electric Tesla cars, children pledged to eat less meat and cycle to school. After planting their trees the children toasted pineapple and apple snacks on a camp fire and returned to school, happy, muddy and inspired.

IT Funding Bid

We have been successful in gaining funding for our IT provision through The Belling Charitable Settlement trust. This will enable us to have new interactive white boards in the classrooms, 32 Chrome books and two charging trollies, 8 new desk top PCs, 8 new laptops and a new wifi system. NCi will be providing the installation and training for the new equipment. This gives us an exciting opportunity to develop the use of IT within the curriculum, allowing pupils to develop essential life skills and gain an enjoyment of using technology.

The Green Charter

As educators, we are committed to teach our young people to be environmentally literate and to develop their knowledge, skills, motivation and confidence to practice and promote sustainability in their community.

As organisations, we are committed to ensure any decisions we make about our working practice take into account the impact on the environment, with the aim of adopting sustainable practices wherever possible.

To this end, we will:

- 1. Collectively declare a climate emergency in November 2019.
- 2. Provide opportunities for staff, Governors, children, and community to find out about the climate emergency and what action they can take. Ensure at least one member of staff has climate change training.
- 3. Gain Eco-School status within two years, then maintain it thereafter.
- 4. Significantly reduce the use of single-use plastic with the aim of becoming 'plastic free.'
- 5. Develop the school grounds (or other local space) to promote engagement with nature, biodiversity and growing food. Plant at least 30 trees every year (eg free Woodland Trust Packs) and ensure they are looked after.
- 6. Have a meat-free school menu once a week and/or promote the benefits of eating less meat and more seasonal, locally-sourced food.
- 7. Speak out. Staff work with pupils to engage with parents and community in order to promote action on climate change.
- 8. Engage with another school (nationally or internationally) about action in schools.
- 9. Support Cornwall Council's aim to become carbon neutral by:
 - reducing energy consumption by at least 10%
 - using some form of renewable energy source on site, where possible
 - buying energy from renewable suppliers, where possible
- 10. Explore ways to lessen the impact of petrol and diesel vehicles on the environment.
