# **Covid Updates and Changes**

An additional letter was sent home last week after the government guidance was published to allow us to make changes that came into place from Monday.

The key points are:

- We are able to continue to provide a broad and balanced curriculum during this period.
- We will endeavour to continue with sports club for Years 4, 5 and 6 to provide childcare during this lockdown period. All other clubs will be cancelled until further notice.
- Reception children will be collected at 1.50pm on Fridays.
- It is recommended that any adults gathering on the school site wear a mask.
- Children will not be able to mix with others outside of school, however you are able to form a childcare bubble with one other household for the purposes of informal childcare.

## **Covid Cases, Symptoms and Testing**

Please can we ask parents to keep communicating with us regarding symptoms, isolation, track and trace app isolation and testing. If a member of your household shows symptoms of Covid then the whole household need to isolate. Please do not send your child to school if someone in your household has symptoms.

## **Remote Learning**

As part of our Contingency Plan, teachers are ready to support home learning should we need it. We have plans in place in case pupils need to remain at home due to a positive Covid-19 result. Essentially, in order to ensure continuity, class teachers and teaching assistants will support your child's learning through daily contact via virtual meetings, emails and learning platforms. The government have raised the expectation that if a child is isolating and is still well that they should be working for the whole school day, following a similar timetable to the one offered in schools.
