# **Staff Updates**

Miss Beth Draper, our current Year 6 teacher, has been successful in her application for a new teaching post. Beth will be leaving Marlborough School at the end of the summer term, the same time as the Year 6s, who coincidentally Beth taught when they were in Year 2 in her first teaching post here.

# **Learning Out and About and In School**

Music Sessions- Pupils in Years 2 and 3 are working with Lucetta learning how to play Samba drums and the recorder. We have access to 15 recorders but pupils are welcome to bring in their own. Year 4 Litter Pick- As part of their learning on plastic pollution Year 4 pupils are carrying out a community litter pick. All the plastic waste collected will be donated to Exeter Council, who will then sort, shred and manufacture it into a stage for the forthcoming Glastonbury music festival – which will be named the 'Gas Tower' stage and dance arena. Year 4 are helping to fill one of 100 bags distributed in the South West. This initiative is the brainchild of Keep Britain Tidy, Orca Sound Project and Shangri-La Glastonbury. Class 4 pupils will become #litterheroes. Choir Concert- Many thanks to Miss Finnegan and the school choir for the wonderful concert on Friday. Choir will resume in the Autumn Term. History Walk- Year 5 pupils are heading out on Wednesday 22nd May for a History Detective Tour around Falmouth linked to their Packet Ships' learning. Maritime Museum- Year 1 pupils are taking part in an exciting workshop at the Maritime Museum on Wednesday 22nd May, linking with their explorers' topic. Pupils will be out of school for the whole day and they are able to bring a packed lunch or have a free lunch provided by school. Please speak to Miss Finnegan if you are able to accompany the visit. Queen Mary Gardens- Year 3 pupils and some Year 6 pupils will be helping to keep the seafront looking wonderful by gardening with the Falmouth Town Council team on Thursday 23rd of May. They will be planting our Marlborough School flower bed. Pupils will be out all day and will need a packed lunch.

### Sport in School

**Sports Coach Sessions**- Pupils in Year 6 and 0 are working with our sports coach, Liam, this term. 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


My name is Emily Spooner
