We have a School Improvement Plan, devised by the school community in 2019, that has driven the focus of our staff and governors over the past three years. The current SIP has four targets: We have managed to achieve all of our targets and the progress made over the past three years,

4	To support pupils returning to school through a recovery curriculum after the closure of schools due to Covid-19.		

despite there being a pandemic, has been very positive.

- The quality of teaching learning and assessment throughout the school is good, with children having positive and focussed attitudes to learning, and this has been verified by the School Effectiveness Cornwall team who visit each half term.
- In Summer 2021 we submitted our data to Cornwall Council, although their were no statutory assessments (SATS) due to Covid restrictions. Cornwall's data team compared the attainment of pupils nationally with those who submitted their assessments (11% of all year 6 pupils nationally). The attainment of our pupils in Reception, Year 2 and Year 6 (key assessment points) were above average in reading and writing; as were our Phonics Screening Check results.

Covid Update

Please continue to inform the office team if pupils have symptoms, are being tested or have the result of a Covid test. There has been a rise in the number of cases of Covid in and around school and we are asking families to remain vigilant, look out for symptoms and test if symptoms are present. There has been a change to isolation rules, stating that if a negative LFT is given from a positive case on day 6 and day 7 then they are able to come out of isolation on day 7.

Remote Learning

If your child is isolating and is well enough then class teachers will provide Remote Learning using the virtual platforms. Google Classroom; SeeSaw or Tapestry depending on your child's year group. Office staff or your child's class teacher will call to see if your child is well enough to access learning. Symptoms of COVID-19


