## **Healthy Schools and Marlborough's Pupil Parliament**

I wrote last time about some of the school's recent success in areas covered by the Cornwall Healthy Schools mandate. The School Parliament has now been confirmed as having achieved both Bronze and Silver award levels in the PADL (Proclaiming Active Democracy Loudly) scheme and representatives, including members of the Cabinet have been invited to a reward ceremony at the Council Chambers in New County Hall on Friday 23 June 2017. The Healthy School's team have again recognised that our Pupil Voice structure doesn't match the usual School Council approach, but acknowledge that it works hard to make sure that all children can play a part in making decisions at and for the school. The children have agreed a new constitution and are trialling this from now and through the coming year: the aim is to extend involvement for the infants more effectively following the hard work that all the children did for the review of our school grounds through 2015-2017. From time to time parents do ask about how we gather children's views and the subject came up, along with other questions at last term's Headteacher Coffee morning: anyone interested can find out more about the Parliament at http://marlborough.eschools.co.uk/website/parliament/7828.

# **Update on Learning – Books and Reports**

The new exercise books will now be used in all classes from the beginning of the new school year in September. You can't have failed to notice their delivery boxes filling the foyer shortly before half term, unfortunately too late for us to implement for the summer. This does at least men that we are using remaining old stocks fully and children will be able to start their new classes together with the new common format up and running immediately they return. As mentioned at the beginning of term, there will be a new look to the annual reports, due out on 14 July. We have completed the new design: progress charts will accompany the next steps in English and Maths and information about learning covered in other domains will include effort and achievement grades. Teachers are now busy completing assessments and we think that the range of information now available from the new curriculum assessment software means that we will able to pass on the progress information in a more efficient manner and clearer presentation. 
