Important – Marlborough School Admissions for September 2019

If you have a child born between 1st September 2014 and 31st August 2015, you need to apply for a place in next year's reception class. Full details are available on the school website at: https://marlborough.eschools.co.uk/website/admissions/7895.

Please be aware that even if you already have a child at the school, <u>you will need to apply through</u> <u>the local</u> authority for a younger sibling. It would also help us to keep aware of numbers and places available by letting the school office know if you are applying for a place.

Site Safety

For safety reasons, could I remind parents that younger siblings and, on collection from the class teacher, the children are your responsibility. The children are not permitted to climb on or walk along the walls around the school property during our care and know that they should not do so at any time. Please help us to keep them safe by ensuring they follow this instruction. For your information the wooden hideaway



at the top of the infant garden is a den and is not safe for children to use as a climbing frame. Please also note that children should not use the kitchen garden or access the pond area out of school hours.
